Building update:

Our building project has been coming along slowly, but surely. Our church members have given around \$600.00 to enable us to hire construction workers to finish up the renovation of the auditorium. We should be finishing the major building portion within the next couple of weeks. After that is finished, we will just be left with painting, lighting, and final touches. We are far from finishing the entire building. Once we finish the auditorium, we will begin on making the lobby and Sunday school rooms proper. We ask that you pray that the renovation process will come along quickly and no one would be injured.

Salvations:

A couple of weeks ago, a man named Daniel visited the church. He had seen the church sign and decided to stop by. After the evening service I spent over an hour sharing the plan of salvation with him. When I finished, he looked at me and asked, "Do you think I should just pray now?"
